Purpose of the group:

Rights Ambassadors ensure that all children's rights are guarded and that we as a school do all we can to ensure children's rights are at the heart of our policies, planning and ethos. The group is mentored by a member of staff.

The Rights Ambassadors agree to:

- ✓ Ensure that opportunities for rights to be taught and planned are utilised within the school
- ✓ Ensure that they are known by the whole school community so pupils are able to discuss concerns and issues with them
